

through Jesus Christ our Saviour. **Amen.**

Let us pray for all who do not believe the gospel of Christ:
for those who have never heard
the message of God's love in Christ;
for those who have lost their faith,
for those who are indifferent to Christ,
for those who actively oppose Christ by word or deed,
and persecute Christ's disciples,

for those who in the name of Christ have persecuted others,
that God will open their hearts to the truth,
and lead them to faith and obedience of God's ways.

Veneration of the Cross

The cross is carried into the church.

*While the cross is being carried up the aisle,
the Priest will pause three times, and sing:*

This is the wood of the cross
On which hung the Saviour of the world.
Come let us worship.

(During the singing of the song, the image of the cross will be displayed for people to reflect upon.)

Song during the Veneration of the Cross:

As we forgive those**

**who trespass against us;
And lead us not into temptation,
But deliver us from evil.
For thine is the kingdom,
The power, and the glory,
For ever and ever.
Amen.**

Closing Prayer

Priest: Send down your abundant blessing,
O Lord,
upon your people
who have devoutly recalled
the death of your Son
in the sure and certain hope
of the resurrection.
Grant them pardon;
bring them comfort.
May their faith grow stronger
and their eternal salvation be assured.
We ask this through Christ our Lord.

All: **Amen.**


