

An Order for Night Prayer (Compline) in Easter

Preparation

The Lord almighty grant us a quiet night and a perfect end.

Amen.

Our help is in the name of the Lord
who made heaven and earth.

A period for reflection on the past day may follow.

We reflect on the day:

For the love shared
We are grateful

For provision and nurture
We are grateful

For kindness given
We are grateful.

For the sorrow we've caused,
we pray for forgiveness

For injustices ignored,
we pray for forgiveness.

For the encounters with God today, in stranger and friend,
We bid you welcome.

For the encounters missed today,
**We know that you always see us
even when we don't see you.**

For tomorrow,
**May we see you
in ways expected and unexpected.**

The following or other suitable words of penitence may be used

**Most merciful God,
we confess to you,
before the whole company of heaven and one another,
that we have sinned in thought, word and deed
and in what we have failed to do.
Forgive us our sins,
heal us by your Spirit
and raise us to new life in Christ. Amen.**

O God, make speed to save us.
O Lord, make haste to help us.
Glory to the Father and to the Son
and to the Holy Spirit;
as it was in the beginning is now
and shall be for ever. Amen.
Alleluia.

The following or another suitable hymn may be sung

Before the ending of the day,
Creator of the world, we pray
That you, with steadfast love, would keep
Your watch around us while we sleep.
From evil dreams defend our sight,
From fears and terrors of the night;
Tread underfoot our deadly foe
That we no sinful thought may know.
O Father, that we ask be done
Through Jesus Christ, your only Son;
And Holy Spirit, by whose breath
Our souls are raised to life from death.

The Word of God

Psalmody. The following psalm may be used.

Psalm 140

- 1 Bless the Lord, O my soul. ◆
O Lord my God, how excellent is your greatness!
- 2 I You appointed the moon to mark the seasons, ◆
and the sun knows the time for its setting.
- 22 You make darkness that it may be night, ◆
in which all the beasts of the forest creep forth.
- 23 The lions roar for their prey ◆
and seek their food from God.
- 24 The sun rises and they are gone ◆
to lay themselves down in their dens.
- 25 People go forth to their work ◆
and to their labour until the evening. **R**

- 26 O Lord, how manifold are your works! ♦
In wisdom you have made them all;
the earth is full of your creatures.
- 27 There is the sea, spread far and wide, ♦
and there move creatures beyond number, both small and great.
- 28 There go the ships, and there is that Leviathan ♦
which you have made to play in the deep.
- 29 All of these look to you ♦
to give them their food in due season.
- 30 When you give it them, they gather it; ♦
you open your hand and they are filled with good.
- 31 When you hide your face they are troubled; ♦
when you take away their breath,
they die and return again to the dust.
- 32 When you send forth your spirit, they are created, ♦
and you renew the face of the earth.
- 33 May the glory of the Lord endure for ever; ♦
may the Lord rejoice in his works; **R**

send your Holy Spirit to renew this living world,
that the whole creation,
in its groaning and striving,
may know your loving purpose
and come to reflect your glory;
in Jesus Christ our Lord.*
