Definition J. Piper

Prophecy in this "third category" (the New Testament gift of prophecy) is a regulated message or report in human words usually made to the gathered believers based on a spontaneous, personal revelation from the Holy Spirit for the purpose of edification, encouragement, consolation, conviction or guidance but not necessarily free from a mixture of human error, and thus needing assessment on the basis of the apostolic (Biblical) teaching and mature spiritual wisdom.

Waiting Examples in the Bible

- 1. Sarah waited 35 years, to have the baby promised to her.
- 2. Jesus waited <u>AD</u> years, to start His ministry.
- 3. Moses waited $\frac{40}{2}$ years to get to the promised land.
- 1. Festus and Paul (Acts 25:1-12)
- 2. Festus and Agrippa (Acts 25:13-22)

3. Paul before Agrippa (Acts 25:23-26:32)

4. Paul's Testimony (Acts 26:1-23)

Paul chose to share about his religious upbringing and training, and his zeal in persecuting followers of Jesus of Nazareth (v.2-11). Paul then went on to describe his encounter with Jesus on the road to Damascus (v.12-18) and the changes that occurred in his life afterward (v.19-23). Anytime Christians share their testimony, they can expect a variety of responses.

1) How to Keep a Positive Perspective

2) Sharing Your Changed Life

- Do you remember or realize what the Lord has brought you or kept you from?
- In Paul's longest speech in the book of Acts 28 verses he reviewed his past. As an exercise in joy, list some of the positive changes that have taken place in you since you became a Christian. Then give thanks to God for His work of transforming you into the image of His Son (Romans 8:29)

"How is your patience quotient right about now? Do you ever feel like Sarah did? That you have been praying for some concern and nothing seems to be happening? And Paul? Surely he wondered about God's promise that he would go to Rome. Well, Sarah did get her son, and as you will see in Acts 28:16, Paul did make it to Rome. In both cases, prayers were answered and God's promises were kept – in God's timing.

Are there prayers you regularly lift to the Lord that are still unanswered? Be patient. God has a plan — and a purpose. Pray for the patience only the Holy Spirit can give you while you wait. Pray to be content right where you are, with what you have and don't have, in whatever circumstance. Take to heart the encouragement of the psalmist:

"I waited patiently for the LORD;

And He inclined to me,

and heard my cry."
