Guidance on Spiritual Communion and Coronavirus

(from the Church of England, authorized by Bishop David Edwards)

On this 8th Sunday after Pentecost, we share in Spiritual Communion. The term ‘Spiritual Communion’ has been used historically to describe the means of grace by which a person, prevented for some serious reason from sharing in a celebration of the Eucharist, nonetheless shares in the communion of Jesus Christ. This period of Covid-19 recovery is one such time. Spiritual Communion offers Christians an opportunity to give thanks for our communion with Jesus when we would ordinarily be able to partake bread and wine at the Eucharist.

The Church is not defined by the walls of a building but by the Body of Christ of which we are members. In making our communion spiritually, we are joining with Christians everywhere to be nourished by the one who tells us, ‘I am the Bread of Life’.

An Act of Spiritual Communion

We pray together:

Lord, have mercy. Christ, have mercy. Lord, have mercy.

Jesus said, 'I am the bread of life. Whoever comes to me will never be hungry, and whoever believes in me will never be thirsty.' John 6.35

Lord Jesus Christ, we give thanks for your saving death and resurrection, and we ask You to be with us now.

Thanks be to you, Lord Jesus Christ,

for all the benefits you have given us,

for all the pains and insults you have borne for us.

Since we cannot now receive you sacramentally,

We ask you to come spiritually into our hearts.

O most merciful redeemer, friend, and brother, may we know you more clearly, love you more dearly, and follow you more nearly, day by day. **Amen.** *Adapted from the Prayer of St Richard of Chichester*

Lord, in these days of mercy, make us quiet and prayerful.

in these days of challenge, make us stronger in you.

in these days of emptiness, take possession of us.

in these days of waiting, open our hearts to the mystery of your cross. **Amen.** *Angela Ashwin*

During August

During August, services will continue at St. Luke's, since operating with a washroom that has hot and cold running water is a requirement by government during the Covid-19 recovery phase.

Some folks have been asking about Holy Eucharist. We have been missing this most sacred sacrament during the Covid-19 pandemic but understand that people's health and safety come first. We are proceeding with caution.

On the 1st and 3rd Sunday of August, there will be Holy Eucharist, with communion in one kind, bread only. To respect physical distancing and limit movement around the interior of the church nave, we will administer the bread at the end of the service, as folks are leaving the church.

On the 2nd and 4th Sundays of August, there will be Morning Prayer.
