Celebrant We break this bread to share in the body of Christ.



Amen.



BEIRUT CRISIS AND PWRDF - PWRDF Pledges \$25,000 to Beirut Explosion Response. PWRDF stands in solidarity with the people of Lebanon, and we pray for all who are responding to this disaster. Many people are still missing and tens of thousands have lost their properties. Hospitals, schools, universities and clinics have been badly damaged. The explosion has added to the already present trauma of economic and political challenges, and the impact of COVID-19. PWRDF has been in contact with partner the Middle East Council of Churches (MECC) to express our sorrow, solidarity and prayers. PWRDF is pledging \$25,000 to the ACT Alliance appeal for Beirut. News from Our Place: Keeping clean and cool in the summer is always a challenge for the folks who use our services. Our hygiene department, with showers and foot-care (thanks to our wonderful foot-care volunteer, Kabir) has been extra busy since we reopened our Drop-in in July and we are running very short on face cloths, shampoo and conditioner (travel sized bottles are ideal), cotton swabs, toothbrushes and toothpaste, dental floss and disposable razors and shaving cream and travel size packs of facial tissues. A hairbrush, some body powder and new underwear (men's and women's) and fresh socks go a long way to making a person feel refreshed after a shower. Your generous donations of these items, and for the hot weather, baseball caps, sunscreen and bottled water, are so very welcome and appreciated by folks who spend the majority of each day outside. KAIROS PRISON MINISTRY PRAYER REQUEST- Remember those in prison, as if you were there yourself. Hebrews 13:3a

We ask you to pray for prisoners, on Vancouver Island and throughout Canada, pray especially for those at Clallam Bay Correction Centre in Washington State. The folks in prison are unable to have family visits or any other visitors from the outside community, including Kairos volunteers.

Pray for the Holy Spirit to indwell the Kairos community inside, pray for their health and safety.
