Sunday Morning Adult Forum

September 15 - Recycling at Holy Cross Beginning is September we will working with Hillside Solutions for our trash removal and recycling. We will have the following services: Composting, Glass Recycling, Fiber (cardboard & paper) Recycling, Container (plastic, metal, energy bag) Recycling and Landfill. We will also be serving as a Compost Club Host Site Alternative for our neighborhood. The staff and cleaning service people who work at Holy Cross will be meeting with a representative from Hillside Solutions sometime soon to learn how to implement our recycling program. On Sunday, September 15, during the Adult Forum, we will share with the congregation what we learned.

September 22 & 29 - Immigration On Wednesday, August 21, Holy Cross held a Prayer Service for Refugees and Immigrants. After the service, many people stayed to discuss what Holy Cross might do to respond to the immigrant and refugee crisis. It was decided that the first step should be to better educate ourselves. That education process will begin at the Adult Forums Sunday mornings, September 22 & 29. We will start by looking at what our own church, the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America (ELCA), is doing to address the topic of immigration.

The Adult Forum meets Sunday mornings, beginning September 15, between worship services, 9:45 to 10:45 am, in the Fellowship Hall.



This year, we are honored to have Dan Huseh designate funds in memory of his parents to complete our lower note chimes and lower note bells, giving us four complete octaves (G3-G7) for the chimes and bells. Three 3-foot tables, pads, mallets, and book/stands were purchased to accommodate the new instruments. The memorial is as follows:

“Given in Memory of Pastor Joseph and Elaine Huseh”

One of Dan’s early memories was of his father directing the adult choir at his second parish at Centennial Lutheran in Denver, Colorado, when the director wasn’t there. Both Pastor Joseph and Elaine were very much involved in music thorough out their life time.
