

EAC Covid Guidelines

Help us to love and care for each other by seeking to do the following:

1. Do seek to be as **patient and gracious** with one-another as possible.
2. Do **help us with actions** that will reduce the risk of COVID-19 in our congregation.
3. **If you are at higher risk of harm** due to COVID-19, we encourage you to stay home. (This includes if you are immunosuppressed, have significant chronic diseases, or are older/frail).
4. **Self Screening:** Do stay home if you have a fever, cough, fatigue, or other symptoms that may be due to COVID-19 (see the COVID-19 Symptom Self Assessment at the bottom).
5. **Other Screening:** Please note that our leadership and volunteers will be doing screening for COVID symptoms. In order to protect all of our attendees and comply with provincial regulations, we may ask you to go home if you are acutely ill (e.g. fever, cough)
6. Strive for **physical distancing** - 2 meters (2 meters should cover it, but in case it needs to be said, please avoid handshakes, hugs and/or kisses with those outside your family or social bubble).
7. Practice impeccable **hand hygiene**. Frequently wash your hands or use hand sanitizer.
8. **Masks are mandatory**, especially when physical distancing is not possible with those outside your family or social bubble. (Note - children under age 11 will be exempt from having to wear a mask).
9. **RSVP:** Register for all in-person events and meetings, as instructed.
10. **Please assist** those who may be greeting you and providing guidance as you enter and exit the parking lot, the EAC building and your designated seating area.
11. **Bible/Pen/Offering:** Bring yours from home. Bring **Offering already prepared** for "drop off".
12. **If you have children**, please take steps to keep them within arms-reach, so that they too can help us maintain physical social distancing.
13. **Expect challenges**, there will be changes and adjustments in how we do things.
14. **Be friendly and understanding** with one another. Guard your heart from being judgemental of others with different standards from you.

Life with COVID-19 is not easy. There will be lots of different opinions and challenges along the way. Help us as we seek to find ways to worship God and serve one another. The path is new and we will have bumps along the way.
