

The Rector's Corner

Archbishop Edwards is to be with us today at 10 AM to confirm four young people. He will do what has been done in the Church for many centuries: he will lay his hand on top of their head and pray that they will be strengthened in their Christian walk by the Holy Spirit. To be specific, we believe that the Holy Spirit gives seven gifts to those who come faithfully for Confirmation. These seven gifts are named in the Bishop's prayer at the bottom of page 559. They actually come from the Book of the Prophet Isaiah, chapter 11, verses 2-3. One commentator explains them in this way:

Wisdom – to help us in our search after God;

Understanding – to lead us to a knowledge of the truth;

Counsel – to help us discern the right path;

Might – strength or courage to confirm us in doing what is right;

Knowledge – to teach us the will of God;

True Godliness – to help us to lead good and holy lives;

Holy Fear – to aid us in loving and obeying God as our Father.

The Holy Spirit who gives us new birth in Baptism, gives us these spiritual gifts in Confirmation. These gifts are all about *wanting* to follow Jesus and *actually doing whatever it takes* to follow Him. We all know how easily distracted we are; and how strong the temptations can be to do what *feels* good rather than what *is* good. We all need the Lord's help. We need the new, and risen and eternal life of Christ which the Holy Spirit gives.

Above, and on either side of the Altar seven lamps are hanging. These represent the seven gifts of the Holy Spirit. Every time we come into the Church, these remind us of the Lord's love for us and of His desire to help us by His Spirit.

Today, the Altar hanging is red. It is another sign of the Holy Spirit – particularly of the tongues (or flames) of fire which rested over the heads of the disciples on the Day of Pentecost. The Love of God burns like a fire for us and within us by the Holy Spirit. He yearns to help us to follow Jesus. He is our Counsellor and Strengthener, and He comes personally to every heart that will receive Him.

There's one more thing: while the Bishop confirms God's Love and good will upon each of us by laying his hand on our head; so we confirm our love

for God by getting out of our seat, coming forward and kneeling before the Bishop in the presence of the Congregation. This public action tells everyone that we want to live the new life, in Christ and with Him, in the fellowship of His Church, by the powerful help of the Holy Spirit.

May all that is confirmed today continue in each life until the Lord returns.
