Dear Street Hope Supporters,

The past year we have seen God at work in many ways through Street Hope Victoria. Even though we have faced challenges, there have been reminders of God's faithfulness and care. Here are some of those highlights.

God's faithfulness in the life of Erick Hinton



Last year we let you know that Erick, one of our longest serving volunteers (since 2000), was sick. Unfortunately, he passed away in October. You might wonder how this is a reminder of God's faithfulness. Well, Erick was a reflection of God's faithfulness and care to all of us, both to the Street Hope volunteers and to the visitors. Erick had a ministry of filling in the gaps. When the gap was filled, he moved on. However, he liked Street Hope so much, he stayed for a long time! He used to say "Our purpose in this ministry is not to feed hungry people, but to show the love of God to people... and how do you show love to hungry people? You feed them!"

Rick Sandberg (who started Street Hope) remembers meeting Erick: *The first time I saw Erick was at a Street Hope meeting in the basement of St. Philips Church – big, bearded and super friendly. "I think maybe the Lord wants us to work together," is what I concluded after we first met – at least that's what Erick told me. In any case, it was the beginning of a long friendship and for Erick another chapter of a life of humble service to others. Erick was a man of faith who wanted to serve God and help his neighbours. Erick helped and touched many people – he was always more than willing to help anyone anyway he could. I actually did see him give the shirt off his back on the 600 block of Yates Street to someone who asked him – he never held back from anyone who asked anything of him.*

What I remember, and countless people will remember about Erick are two things: you could ask Erick for anything and if he could do it, he would; and Erick lived trusting his Creator for everything. Everyone who knows Erick knows they met a true servant of God and man. I know I did, and I am grateful for Erick's example of faith, love and humility.

We will miss Erick, and his gentle way of responding to people, and his inspiring trust in God. Erick could even see God's faithfulness when he was sick with cancer. He commented that it was God-ordained that another volunteer, Peter Waterman, recently came on to help out. Peter is part of the team of drivers that bring the Street Hope RV downtown on Thursday evenings and has been taking care of things like ensuring the gas tank is full, arranging maintenance or changing the lightbulbs – filling in the "gaps" that Erick could no longer fill.


God's faithfulness seen by our visitors

We see that as a sign that God is at work in their lives, and that he is making himself known to them.
