



Welcome Reverend Kerry Stover

On May 21, 2019 the Congregation approved extending a call to Rev. Kerry Stover as our Associate Minister. Kerry will be focusing on our Fresh Start ministry, including special community events, overseeing the Youth and Sunday School programs and bringing more focus to Social Justice and Human Rights issues.

Although Kerry comes to us as a recently ordained minister, Kerry has been called to be a follower in the ways of Jesus Christ all of his life.

Kerry's faith journey in the United Church of Canada began with baptism at Grace UC in St. Thomas, Ontario, where he attended until the family moved to Scarborough. His father's work took the family to the United States in the 60's.

After completing his Industrial Engineering Technology degree in New Jersey, he returned to St. Thomas, Ontario and worked as a quality engineer at a local manufacturing company. He was hired by Siemens Automotive, in London, in the late 80's. He was promoted to management and became the Senior Manager of Information Technology for the Siemens automotive-related divisions in Canada. Kerry completed his secular career in May 2015 at London Health Sciences Centre, Information Technology Services as a Senior Business Systems Analyst for the Human Resources and Finance departments.

During his formative years in the United States, Kerry and his family attended the United Church of Christ in Phillipsburg, New Jersey and he sang in the youth choir. While attending university he joined a United Church of Christ congregation in East Brunswick, New Jersey, where he continued his love of choral singing.

Upon returning to Canada he moved to London and has since been a member at First-St. Andrews (FSA) UC. He joined the choir at FSA and has been actively involved in congregational work over the years: Social Action, Worship, Music, Property, Finance, church council and the many Broadway productions that FSA has produced. He chaired the committee that oversaw FSA becoming AFFIRM United, a first for the former Middlesex Presbytery of the former London Conference.

Kerry has volunteered, over the years, for the Children's Aid Society (1986-1990), Ark Aid Christmas Day dinner (1990-1996), FSA Hospitality Meal (1997-2001), Bridges Out of Poverty (2013-2015), Hospice of London (1997-2000), Aids Committee of London (Regional HIV/AIDS Connection) (1985-2002) and London's Musical Theatre Productions (8 years as the Board Chair) (2001-2010).

Until just recently, he has sung with the Broadway Singers, FSA choir and the Pride Men's Chorus London.

Kerry completed the UCC Licensed Lay Worship Leader training at the Five Oaks Centre in June 2014. In November 2014 he was offered the position of Minister of Visitation at Siloam UC and left that in September 2018 to complete his Supervised Education Experience (SME) at Kincardine United.



Kerry has been a candidate for ordination since June 2015 and completed the first two years of his Master of Divinity at Huron University College (HUC) in London, where he was a member of the Bishop Hallam Theological Society as Treasurer. He was awarded two scholarships while at HUC: Youth Ministry and Christian Leadership. He transferred to Emmanuel College at University of Toronto to complete his M.Div. and the UCC Testamur. He graduated from Emmanuel in May 2018.

Kerry was ordained on May 25, 2019 by the Antler River Watershed Regional Council.

While in Kincardine, his SME experience offered him the opportunity of team ministry and working with a vibrant youth group.

Kerry is honoured to be called to serve with Rev. Hugh Reid, Rev. Leanne Ketcham, Rev. Dr. David Winsor and the dedicated volunteers who share the light of Christ in the greater community. He will start his journey with Kingsway-Lambton on July 15, 2019.

In his spare time, Kerry enjoys walking his dog, live theatre, time with family and friends, mystery novels, wine tastings, golf (although he is not very good) and flat-water canoeing.

The youth ministry at Kingsway-Lambton has had a vibrant and fun year together! We closed it out this past weekend with a sleepover at the church because there's nothing quite like sleeping on the floor of the clubroom to celebrate another wonderful year of journeying together in faith and life.

One of the highlights of these past couple of months for me was Confirmation. A dynamic and loving group of ten students committed to exploring questions about faith and life together from February through June.

We talked through questions like, "Why did Jesus have to die?" "What is prayer and why do we

pray?" "Who is the Holy Spirit?" Along the way we spent a great deal of time laughing, eating, and wondering together.

We enjoyed a retreat together in the beginning of May in Eugenia.

Retreats and camps have an integral role to play in spiritual formation for youth. They allow them to unplug from the pressures of school, sports, and more. They provide a new space where youth can intentionally connect with Jesus in prayer, nature, and community.



This year we tried something new with Confirmation, pairing each of our teens with an adult in the KLUC church family to be "prayer partners". Throughout the months, the adults and teens wrote letters to each other anonymously before getting to meet one another before Confirmation. This was one of the most joyous aspects of the whole experience as adults and teens got to share their faith journeys together, mutually encouraging and supporting one another. I cannot express my gratitude to the adults who took part in the prayer partner experience, and to the whole congregation for your prayers and support. You have made all the difference in welcoming these amazing teens into our church family.

The Confirmation service was held on June 9th, as the teens publicly affirmed their acceptance of God's love for them in Jesus Christ.

And it would not be right to close this academic year of ministry without a shout-out to two heroes of our youth program. Jennifer Visser and Richard Efting continue to teach Sunday school with passion and fun, while also inviting and encouraging teens to join the worship of Fresh Start. Jennifer and I led Confirmation together, with Richard doing an untold amount of behind the scenes clean-up support. Their faithfulness to this ministry is an immense gift to me and the countless teens who have been loved by them. Thank you, Jennifer and Richard!

Fresh Start Service: A Promising First Year

Fresh Start ended its first year with some AMAZING news! The United Church of Canada (UCC) has given it a grant for THREE years. UCC also funded Fresh Start’s first year.

The purpose of each grant is to build a new faith community by bringing lapsed church-goers, and those who have never attended, to the service. It has been a promising year for this. The average weekly attendance of over 50 people includes people from both target groups.

Since Fresh Start was piloted in May 2018, there have been many highlights in its inaugural year. A variety of guest speakers, along with our own ministers, provided stimulating talks on everything from resolving conflict to the value of Doubting Thomases. The discussions following sermons explored “spirituality for the way we live now” (as Fresh Start bills itself). Not only is this considered one of the most valuable parts of the service, it also helps build community as people reflect on challenges or revelations from their own lives.

Fresh Start also initiated many special events aimed at involving Kingsway-Lambton’s neighbours. And they came! Over 90 people attended the “All You Need is Love” singalong, held just before Valentine’s Day.

Kingsway-Lambton’s new associate minister, Rev. Kerry Stover, will preside over the service when it resumes in the fall, and everyone looks forward to continuing this inspiring journey with him. A HUGE thank you to intern Stephen Milton and Rev. Leanne Ketcham for this successful first year.

Horizons

“And remember I am with you always, to the end of the age.”

Matthew 28:20 NRSV



At the time of writing, spring has been very slow getting off the runway. It seems we are in a state of suspended animation, waiting for this season to begin.

Some horizons are like that. They keep receding as we hurry to reach them. Horizons, as destinations, give us a place of arrival, a time when we can start, finally! It's nice to have such a goal – a graduation day, or a wedding day, or a new job, or the next Raptors' game. But sometimes, that goal takes away from now. We are in a state of suspension until that day arrives. This can occur with something as mundane as standing in line or sitting in traffic. We are not where we are because we're invested in some future place or future time. Where we are, can be neglected, even missed.

Sometimes the horizon is not clear. It is a vague hope or a dream. If we cannot pin it to a definite time or place, we feel a need to let go of it, even a precious hope, to get on with our lives. It can be too distracting. I struggle sometimes as I strive for the future of the church in a time of cynicism and individualism. Does one let go of a precious hope. I struggle sometimes as I miss loved ones and the things I had looked forward to with them. Is this too distracting?

But some horizons don't lie agonizingly in the future. They can be as definite as an ocean sunrise or they can be as vague and unformed as a hope against hope, but they shape our lives, here and now. They are not so much about where we are going but about why we are here and who we are. They do not demand we wait to begin, instead they challenge us to live in their light, in the assurance of their coming. Such horizons aren't in the distance, they keep moving toward us.

Time can be like that, growing older. It moves toward us. When we know we don't have limitless time, we are pressed to use it well, though time can panic us. Love is another horizon that moves toward us. Love is a hopeful expectancy that changes your day and gives significance to your moments. You see yourself and others differently, even the “so and so” in the never-ending line of traffic ahead of you. When love is your horizon, you are bathed in a different light. There is not panic but patience, not a sense of things running down so much as a gathering richness.



In the light of the resurrection of Jesus Christ, love is the horizon of all creation. We have the hope of heaven which is not punting today away, it is to have today in the embrace of what will be forever.

The good golfing weather and blossoms may be delayed, the traffic slow, the Raptors may take 7 games* and the Leafs 70 years, but there is no need to delay loving one another.

Dollars and Sense

2019 Operating Budget and 1st Quarter Results

By way of background, the 2019 operating budget was approved by the Official Board at our last meeting on Feb 5th, and then by the congregation at the annual meeting on Feb 24th. The budget is calling for a deficit of \$34,706. We feel that this is a manageable number, given that we have ended the prior 3 years with surpluses of approximately the same amount.

Overall, the 1st quarter 2019 results to the end of March are quite satisfactory. Our most important number, local-use offerings, is encouraging. At \$137,000, it is 8% ahead of budget and 6% ahead of last year.

Expenses are all under control. The majority of our expenses are under budget. Money has been set aside to support our Fresh Start initiative.

The net result is a very small surplus of approximately \$1,000, which is about where we were last year at this point in time. We had budgeted for a loss, so we are about where we want to be.

I will update the numbers for the next issue of *The Carillon*.

Kingsway-Lambton Philosophy Reading Group

Starting in July, Kingsway-Lambton United Church will host a weekly **Philosophy Reading Group**. The purpose of this group is to move guided philosophical conversation and reflection out of the Academy's Ivory-Tower (away from all the grades and deadlines) and into the community where it originated.

By definition, philosophy is the love of wisdom. However, this love assumes many forms. Our weekly meetings will serve to unpack the nature of this loving pursuit in a calm, dignified, and personal way. We will explore the countless wonderful ways philosophy can enrich our lives, relationships, and world through reading and discussing short yet accessible texts from the history of philosophy (distributed a week in advance through e-mail list-serve), viewing clips from classical and popular cinema, and even listening to various kinds of music. But most importantly we will learn from one another!

Our meetings will offer a free and friendly environment through which we will discuss matters related to (but not limited to) the following:

- ✦ Epistemology, or, how do we know what we know?
- ✦ Metaphysics, or, what is the ultimate nature of reality?
- ✦ Ethics, or how do we live properly?
- ✦ Do we live in the best of all possible worlds?
- ✦ Does God exist?
- ✦ Are we free, determined, or some combination of these two?
- ✦ Human Nature, Subjectivity and Personal Experience
- ✦ Objectivity, Science and Physicalism



Our world is in a bad way at present. We need help from every source we can garner! Philosophy is too important to leave to the machinations of politicians, the frivolous opportunism of pop-singers and “artists”, or to have its value eroded by advertisements and media saturation. For Plato (by way of Socrates), philosophy was vital to the well-being of the soul. Let's learn to help take care of our souls in this oft-forgotten (or, at least misunderstood) way. Let's discuss some philosophy!

An Interview with Avalon Neale

"I don't think it's overestimating it to say that right after my family and closest friends, Kingsway-Lambton is there, right there"

Early in our interview, these words were spoken by Avalon and they freely show the love and affection she holds for her church. Avalon is a long-standing member of K-L since 1980, and she has been very active over all the years as an elder, choir member and member of committees, including: Search, New Members, Music, Alpha and Welcoming, to mention a few.

She describes K-L as a huge influence in her life and, when she looks into her crystal ball, her first desire going forward is to see K-L become an affirming church. Smaller outlying community churches have moved faster on this than those in large centres, says Avalon, but in order to be successful in the future, change will have to happen. The church will have a new look with an expanded role for music and a changing format for the service. She really thinks to accomplish some of this change, we need to call in the "pros" to help just like we are doing to rehabilitate the organ. Like the tides that go in and out, things will come back to K-L but it will need to look different when that happens.

Avalon is one of our members who has indicated that Kingsway-Lambton is in her will with a legacy gift, and she thinks that this is extremely important for her generation to do. It is, for her, both gratitude and pay-back to the past generations who have provided, but also it is the chance to help sustain the church and facilitate the time to evolve. "If we don't step up it may be too late and certainly our generation can afford to do this", she says. She also thinks it is important for all members to know that legacy doesn't have to be a huge amount in your will, but that all gifts both large and small matter and are welcome. In her words, "it is the future".

Avalon welcomes some of the additions such as "Fresh Start" and hopes to see our music programme evolve and expand, but knows that all these initiatives take time and money, both of which she has committed to in her own unique way.

In April of this year, the Alan Jackson Company, in conjunction with Casavant, began work on our organ renewal. This exciting retrofit of the organ is a significant effort, and it means we won't have use of the organ until September.

This major capital project is being led by Jim Gallagher. Throughout the weeks since the work began, Jim has provided updates through notices in the bulletin and photos displayed before Sunday services, allowing the congregation to follow the progress of the project.

As of Mid-June, the project is on time and on Budget. Work on our organ is taking place on-site, in Alan Jackson's shop, at Classic works and at the Casavant factory. The Committee expects the console to return to the church in August and the tuning of the organ to start in Mid-September with an expected return to full function by the end of September.




Coming This Fall: New Church Photo Directory
