As we do this we recognize and honour the image of God in which we are created.

Celebration of the Eucharist

Altar is prepared with the offerings of bread and wine. the priest then prays a prayer offering these gifts to God.

Priest The Lord be with you.

People And also with you.

Priest Lift up your hearts.

People We lift them to the Lord.

Priest Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.

People It is right to give our thanks and praise.

The priest continues with one of the Eucharistic prayers from the authorized books.

Holy, Holy, Holy Lord, God of power and might

Heaven and earth are full of your glory,

Hosanna in the highest.

Blessed is the one who comes in the name of the Lord,

Hosanna in the highest.

Therefore we proclaim the mystery of faith.

People Christ has died, Christ is risen, Christ will come again.

As the Eucharistic Prayer ends the priest elevates the bread and chalice.

Priest As our Saviour taught us, let us pray.

**People Our Father in heaven,
 hallowed be your name,
 your kingdom come,
 your will be done, on earth as it is in heaven.**

Give us today our daily bread.

Forgive us our sins

as we forgive those who sin against us.

Save us from the time of trial,

and deliver us from evil.

For the kingdom,

the power and the glory are yours,

now and forever. Amen

Breaking of the Bread

The priest breaks the bread so it may be shared

Priest Creator of all, you gave us golden fields of wheat,
Whose many grains we have gathered and made

People Thanks be to God

The priest prepares the bread so it may be shared. Members of the congregation will be directed forward by the sides people, please wait until you are invited. Only the bread is distributed. Traditional Anglican teaching is that if we receive in one kind we have received the fullness of the Sacrament. Gluten –free wafers are available on request.

All Saints Day—November 1

Saints are people we want to remember because of their remarkable deeds and strong witness to God. Many are named in our calendar in the BAS, and some are still waiting to be placed on our calendar. The Anglican Church does not have a canonization process but new names are added to the calendar as communities recognize the worth of those who have lived among them. We do not ask for evidence of miracles or perfection of life.

The Eve of All Saints, or All Hallows, was a day when evil fought against the good in heaven and earth. This is the reason for the popularity of signs of evil, including the misguided notion that witches are evil. But in these times we are more likely to see a pirate or a princess knocking on our door, and Halloween has come to be about mostly innocent fun.

Thanksgiving after Communion

When all have received Communion we give thanks.

All who are able stand and the community prays in silence. Then the priest prays the prayer of thanksgiving after Communion.
