

Frequently Asked Questions

When is the service?

The service of installation and consecration will be held at the Cathedral Church of All Saints on November 30th, 2020 at 7PM.

Will there be a reception after the service?

No. The COVID restrictions make it too difficult to manage.

Can I go to the Cathedral to participate in the service?

Because of the COVID-19 restrictions, only those who receive an invitation from the Synod Office will be able to attend the service in person at All Saints Cathedral.

Is there a place I can go to join a group in watching the service, like we did for the Electoral Synod?

There will be regional and local gatherings in some churches. A list of known gathering places will be posted here by Nov 20th. You may be required to pre-register so that we can keep our numbers in the safe range. We also encourage parishes to arrange a parish or church gathering to view the consecration service. If your parish/church is hosting one, please email synod@nspeidiocese.ca to be added to the list.

Will I be able to watch the Consecration live online from home?

If I can't watch it live, will I still be able to watch the service later?

Yes, a recorded version will be made available a day or two later at the same addresses.

If my parish wants to setup a gathering for people to watch the livestream, what are the technical requirements?

You will need:

1. A computer that can access the Internet.
2. An Internet connection in your facility that the computer can connect to, either through wi-fi or with the appropriate cable.
3. A cable to connect the computer to your facility's sound system.
4. A cable to connect the computer to a video projection system.
5. A screen to show the video on.
6. You will not require a Facebook account to access the livestream.
