Labor Force by Industry																														
Note	In 2011, the goods producing sector accounted for 23.4 per cent of the experienced labour force in the SCRD while the services producing sector accounted for 76.7 per cent of the experienced labour force. The proportion for the goods producing sector was 2.9 percentage points higher than the national average (20.5 per cent) and 5.3 percentage points higher than the British Columbia average (18.1 per cent) in 2011.
