

Our Family Snapshot 2018

How We Share God's Blessings

Did you know? We have 235 families whose offerings make up 76% of our revenue. It would require the equivalent of hiring 18 full time employees to do the work of our volunteers. We spent 10,827 hours (1/3 of total volunteer hours) caring for our neighbours, more than any other ministry category. We are living up to our mission to be a loving, caring, community that reaches out to others.

We have responded to God's blessings in our lives by sharing them within and outside our church walls and it is our hope to continue and grow our ministries and give more of God's blessings to our neighbours and each other.

HOT LUNCH MINISTRY Celebrating 10 Years



We are best known to our neighbours through our largest outreach project, Hot Lunch Ministry, which celebrated its 10th anniversary this year. We hope to continue this and other community ministries for many more years.

Due to our rich liturgical history and emphasis on ongoing spiritual development, we have a strong reputation within the diocese for training theological students and future priests. We are also seen as a vibrant multi-cultural community with diverse

worship styles, welcoming everyone heartily and studying the bible in small groups. In the coming year, we will grow together as a spiritual community by exploring The New City Catechism in services and an Alpha program for Youth.

As you read about our activities, we hope that you can see yourself participating in our ministries. Through your support we can grow our precious ministries and continue making St. Timothy's a church home for everyone for years to come.

Worship

Our Sunday worship services include a quiet service of Holy Eucharist at 8am and a service of Holy Eucharist with music at 10am. We also have a Saturday Night Healing Service (SNHS) once a month with contemporary music.

After service we gather for Coffee Hour and share how God is at work in our lives.

Did you know this about Worship?

Average Sunday attendance is 175. Average weekly attendance is 193.

At a typical Sunday 10am service, there are 30 volunteers who prepare the altar, greet attendees, seat people, read scripture and prayers, serve at the altar, lead our singing, count the collection and host coffee hour after the service.

There are 3 lay anointers. We had 20 services with healing and anointing last year.

Spiritual Development

St. Timothy's is passionate about Christian Education and Spiritual Development and we have Christian education programs for all ages.

We also offer Christian education to our neighbours via our VBS summer camps. Here are some of this year's campers and volunteers at a camp reunion event.

We also have weekly adult bible study groups and hold education series throughout the year, such as, an Advent book review and Lenten studies.

Also there were 52 people who participated in the various spiritual formation and learning events during the year.

Caring for Our Congregation

We uplift each other at our social events, such as, the Pancake Supper.



This year's prayer breakfast had 45 people listen to a speaker and pray together.



Our annual BBQ had lots of fun, food and fellowship.



We care for each other via St. Margaret's guild member visitations:

"I have had the privilege of knowing many parishioners over the years at St. Timothy's. Now when these same parishioners are no longer able to attend Church, I have been able to visit them, have a chat, take them communion as well as delivering plants for Christmas and Easter. I believe that those parishioners were happy to have a visit and to know that they are remembered by St. Timothy's."



We have a men's group (Fast Friars) that meet weekly to do woodworking and share fellowship. They delivered 54 projects (including 14 for St. Tim's) with \$2800 in profit donated to the church.

There is also a Craft Club that meets weekly and often contributes their talents to our Outreach programs, Worship decorations and Sunday School.

We also care for each other through the various committees that take care of health and safety, the kitchen and property. Many hours are also spent on administrative activities, such as bookkeeping, website updates, newsletter, telephone tree, fundraising and special events.

Did you know this about Caring for Our Congregation?

Clergy visits to hospital or infirm for communion: 104 last year.

Pastoral visits to the rector's office: 384 last year.

The St. Margaret's Guild has 6 members who visited 17 parishioners last year to deliver communion to parishioners who could not make it to church.

Caring for Our Neighbours

We care for our neighbours near and far through our various outreach programs.

Each Thursday a team of 19 serves a Hot Lunch to homeless and less fortunate guests. Here's how our Hot Lunch guests express their appreciation:

"I live in this area. I lost my job and it's hard for me because I'm over 60. This is very helpful for me because I have no income."

"I'm a parent care-provider. This is really helpful - a healthy meal and a welcoming environment. For people on Ontario Disability Support Program, it's really helpful."

We also have a Wednesday Breakfast program with 3 volunteers that serve breakfast to 9 to 15 homeless people each week.



Volunteers setting up our Advent Tree. Through the Advent Tree, \$1,430 in gift cards plus toys, socks, gloves, and toiletries were collected and given to those in need and families through the Boys and Girls Club Christmas Program.



The Craft Club created 415 unique dolls for a mission to Cuba.
