During August

Services will continue at St. Luke's, since operating with a washroom that has hot and cold running water is a requirement by government during the recovery phase.

On the 1st and 3rd Sunday of August, there will be Holy Eucharist, with communion in one kind, bread only. To respect physical distancing and limit movement around the interior of the church nave, we will administer the bread at the end of the service, as folks are leaving the church.

On the 2nd and 4th and 5th Sundays of August, there will be Morning Prayer.
