This hymn was requested by the Presbyterian United Nations Office and the Presbyterian Peacemaking Program for the celebration of United Nations Day 2007 (October 24).

The first verse is inspired by the Preamble of the United Nations Charter.

The second verse celebrates those who have served and are serving in the United Nations and other international peacemaking efforts.

The third verse lifts up some of the work of UN agencies and programs (like food, environmental, humanitarian and refugee) and draws from Matthew 25:34-40.

The final verse is a prayer that we as people of faith will respond to God's peace by being peacemakers.
