

Evening Prayer

Evening Prayer audio will be offered on the website on Sunday and Wednesday evenings.

You will need a copy of the BAS (for Collects and Psalms) and a copy of this prayer booklet which can be downloaded and printed.

When you participate in evening prayer (where ever you are) you will read as the “People / All” and follow the audio recording on the website throughout the service

In order to follow Evening Prayer online you will find a link on the church website allsaints-agassiz.ca click on “Audio” on the Home page and then click on “Evening Prayer” and start the recording for that given day.

You will be able to access the current Evening Prayer Liturgy List for each days’ readings via the website, this can be found under “Ministries” then “Daily Office”. The list will give you the Psalms and scripture readings for each Sunday and Wednesday.

This order of service is from Eucharistic Prayers, Services of The Word, and Night Prayer, Supplementary to The Book of Alternative Services, pages 49 to 67.

Introductory Responses

All stand. *The officiant will say one of the following sentences proper to the service*

Officiant: O Lord, I call to you: come to me quickly.

People: **Hear my voice when I call to you.**

or

Officiant: Let my prayer be set forth in your sight as incense.

People: **The lifting up of my hands as the evening sacrifice.**

All: **Glory to the Father and to the Son and to the Holy Spirit: as it was in the beginning, is now and will be forever. Amen.**
