The Rev. James G. Cole



Born Died
January 9, 1946 *October 30, 2020*



James George Cole was born in Gainesville, Texas on January 9, 1946 to Jean (née Dixon) and James Floyd Cole. Soon after his birth his family relocated to Dallas where he would graduate from Highland Park High School in 1964. Upon graduation, Jim would enroll at the University of Texas-Austin where he would complete a degree in Journalism in 1968. After graduation, Jim started his career in Advertising. Working for National companies such as: JWalter Thompson, BBDO, Integer Group and Focus Group as it was a career that he truly loved. It was a career that took him all over the world and would eventually land him in the world epicenter of New York City. Jim truly relished a career that led him to work on significant campaigns for clients GTE, Dodge, Pepsi and Alka Seltzer among others. It was in New York where he would meet the love of his life Kathleen Hughes. They married in 1971 in Kings Park, New York. They went on to have three children James Edward (b. 1973), Brian Donald (b. 1976) and Colleen Cynthia (b. 1979).

After a long and successful career in the advertising industry, Jim followed a calling to the ministry while in his 50's. He went on to study at the Perkins School of Theology, which eventually led him to The Chapel of the Cross in Dallas. For 20 years Jim dedicated his life to serving the Lord as an Anglican Priest. It was a role that he relished and took great pride in. He excelled as a pastor, liturgist, and source of wisdom. Jim was a lover of ALL things Texas. He loved his Texas Longhorns, Dallas Cowboys, Texas Steakhouses (Rare only!) and Texas BBQ. Through the years, he had a great interest in History and his English/Scottish heritage. He loved researching his roots and became quite the Anglophile throughout the years.

He is survived by his wife, Kathleen; sons, James Edward and Brian; and daughter Colleen; and son-in-law, Gil; with his two grandchildren, Gilly and Brynn whom he loved dearly. He has a sister, Sally Cole; and nephew Nicholas Ainsworth.
