## Advent

Seasons of preparation precede all the great Feasts of the Church. Indeed, it is said the “those who will not fast cannot feast!” The season of Advent prepares us for the joys of Christmas and the incarnation of our Lord Jesus, the eternal Son and Word of God the Father. Advent always begins on the Sunday closest to November 30th, the traditional feast of the Apostle Andrew, and always includes the four Sundays before Christmas. Advent especially directs the Church to the return of Christ at the end of this age. Other features are also worthy of comment:

1. The First Sunday in Advent is the **beginning of the liturgical year** for the Church.
2. As a time of preparation for the birth and manifestation of the Christ, **the Scripture readings of this season** have traditionally given special attention to the voice of prophecy, with a strong emphasis on the reading of Isaiah and on John the Baptizer’s preaching on repentance.
  - 1st Sunday—Love to recognize Messiah’s promised coming
  - 2nd Sunday—Hope in God’s promises given in the Holy Scriptures
  - 3rd Sunday—Faith to believe the promise brought by Messengers of the Word
  - 4th Sunday—Joy over the nearness of promised Savior
3. The **Advent wreath** is adorned with four candles symbolic of the four millennia covered in Old Testament history. These are lit progressively, one candle being added each week, until Christmas Eve. A fifth candle (white) is known as the Christ candle, found in the center of the wreath, is lighted on Christmas Eve, and burns alone until Epiphany.
4. **Purple** symbolizes royalty, preparation, and solemnity.
5. Although it should not be confused with Lent, Advent is a season of **sober preparation** for God’s coming and is thus a proper second season to strengthen the disciplines of prayer, almsgiving, and fasting. Appropriate to the season is the call to remembrance of loving our neighbor, caring for the poor, mastering our appetites, and ordering our lives and devotion.
