Preparing the Space Around Us

Whoever you are and wherever you are on life's journey, you are welcome here! Welcome if you are gathering on zoom or if you are worshipping at home with the bulletin. We are one community and all part of the body of Christ. Today is the second season of Advent; if you haven't already made an Advent wreath, I encourage you to do so. You don't have to use coloured candles, just use what you have – maybe some rocks or greenery or driftwood. Set up your Advent Wreath in the worship space in your home before sitting down to worship.

Preparing the Space within Us

*Let us prepare now the space within us for a time of worship. I invite you to sit quietly, perhaps with feet on the floor, taking a couple of deep breaths and bring yourself into this moment. Open yourself to the presence of God who is with us and within us . . . as you intentionally open yourself to God, **open yourself also to what you need from this time of worship.***

Advent Candle Lighting

Last Sunday we lit the first candle of our Advent Wreath, the candle of Hope. We light it again as we remember the power of Hope and the difference it makes in the world.

This Sunday we light the second candle, the candle of Peace. We light it knowing full well that Peace is elusive, and in some parts of the world, it is almost completely absent. Yet in this season of Advent, we trust that God is always with us even in war and discord between countries; God is present within families and within our own hearts, gently leading us to new possibilities. This candle reminds us that Christ is the Prince of Peace, the one promises and facilitates healing, wholeness and reconciliation.

Let us pray: **O God of Peace, Emmanuel, God with us, we ask you to send your healing light into our hearts. Soften us to the possibilities of new life within us, reconciliation around us, and a Peace in the world that surpasses all understanding. Holy One, make us whole, we pray. We ask in the name of Jesus, the Prince of Peace. Amen.**

Light your own Advent Wreath

Invitation to Confession

A little later in the service we will be hearing a gospel reading about John the Baptist from the Message translation. It translates the word repentance as “a changed life”. It’s an invitation in this season of Advent to go deeper into truth and deeper into God’s love, that our lives may be changed, even transformed, and we may more fully live in Christ. In this spirit of “a changed life,” I invite you into a modified Examen, an exercise that comes from the Jesuits.

Prayer of Confession

Adapted from the Society of Jesus

Sit comfortably with either a paper and pencil for jotting down thoughts or with eyes closed.

1. Become aware of God’s presence and with the company of the Holy Spirit, recall these first few days of Advent.
2. Bring your awareness to gifts you have received during these days. Perhaps connection through a phone call . . . a walk in nature . . .
3. Bring into your awareness what has been most challenging about these days. Perhaps images on the news . . . feelings of loneliness waiting without a defined end . . . the shortening of daylight hours. What is most difficult to stay present to? Acknowledge these places and invite God’s presence.
4. In the company of the Holy Spirit, breathe into this moment, and into a deeper truth that is at work in you. Open yourself to the warmth of God’s love that surrounds you.
5. Ask for God’s help to guide you forward with this truth.

The good news of Jesus Christ — the Message! — begins here,

John wore a camel-hair habit, tied at the waist with a leather belt. He ate locusts and wild field honey. As he preached he said, "The real action comes next: The star in this drama, to whom I'm a mere stagehand, will change your life. I'm baptizing you here in the river, turning your old life in for a kingdom life. His baptism—a holy baptism by the Holy Spirit—will change you from the inside out."
