Officiant: People of God in this place and in all places, once again, we give thanks that you are worshipping with this community and we welcome you to the Anglican Church of St. Peter, Quamichan as part of our virtual church family. On this the holiest of nights, we come together to share in the Liturgy of the Word as we welcome the One who has come to be the light of the world.

Opening Acknowledgement:

Officiant: In this time and place, we gather on the unceded ancestral territories of the Coast Salish people and the Cowichan Tribes.

In this time and place we gather in the name of the living God.

In this time and place we gather with the community of faith around the globe and across the ages

In this time and place we are not alone, but one in Christ

In this time and place Hallowed, expectant, one people in God

All: In this time and place, heaven and earth are one. In the name of the Holy and Blessed one, Creator, Redeemer and Holy Spirit. Amen.

Lighting the Advent Wreath

Officiant: Today is Christmas Eve, the day we have waited for and prepared for is finally here! Together, as we have been waiting in anticipation we have gathered around a wreath to light candles. The wreath reminds us of the circle of our human community and the lights illuminate the many ways we have prepared ourselves for this Holy Night – Christmas Eve.

The first candle we lit was the candle of Hope – this light has been a reminder that Hope is on the way, a hope that leads us towards good things. Even during days that are hard, God's hope is here.

The second candle we lit, was the candle of peace – this light reminds us that there is a peace from God that goes beyond all understanding. Even though our world is not always a peaceful place, God's peace is always here.

The third candle we lit, was the candle of Joy – this pink candle reminds us to take a moment from our busy preparations for Christmas to share a moment of joy and remember that joy is coming to the world. Even when it's hard to feel it, God's joy is here with us.

The fourth candle we lit, was the candle of Love – this light reminds us of the incredible love that God has for each and every one of us, because we are ALL God's children. Even on days when we don't feel like it, God's love is here.

And now we gather this Christmas Eve and pause to light the center candle. This candle is white and represents the birth of Jesus, the One who God sent to bring hope, peace, joy, and love to all people. This candle reminds us of the innocent little baby born, God Incarnate, to be a wonderful Gift to become the Light of the world always. Even during dark days, Jesus is here and with us.

Officiant: Together let us pray:

All: Emmanuel, you come as a little one, a tiny baby, yet we know that you are God, and you are with us. May the flame of this candle remind us that you are the Light of the World, and that if we follow you, we will never walk in darkness, but will have the true light of life. Amen.

Officiant: I invite you to settle your hearts and minds and be attentive as we hear the words of Scripture for today.

Scripture Reading: Isaiah 62:6-12

Psalms 97

1 The Lord is king; let the earth rejoice; * **let the multitude of the isles be glad.**

2 Clouds and darkness are round about him, * **righteousness and justice are the foundations of his throne.**

3 A fire goes before him * **and burns up his enemies on every side.**

4 His lightnings light up the world; * **the earth sees it and is afraid.**

5 The mountains melt like wax at the presence of the Lord, * **at the presence of the Lord of the whole earth.**

6 The heavens declare his righteousness, * **and all the peoples see his glory.**

7 Confounded be all who worship carved images and delight in false gods! * **Bow down before him, all you gods.**

Affirmation of Faith

Deacon: Let us confess our faith as we say,

All: **We believe in one God, the Father, the Almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all that is, seen and unseen. We believe in one Lord, Jesus Christ, the only Son of God, eternally begotten of the Father, God from God, Light from Light, true God from true God, begotten, not made, of one being with the Father. Through him all things were made. For us and for our salvation he came down from heaven: by the power of the Holy Spirit he became incarnate from the Virgin Mary, and was made man. For our sake he was crucified under Pontius Pilate; he suffered death and was buried. On the third day he rose again in accordance with the scriptures; he ascended into heaven and is seated at the right hand of the Father. He will come again in glory to judge the living and the dead, and his kingdom will have no end. We believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord, the giver of life, who proceeds from the Father. With the Father and the Son he is worshipped and glorified. He has spoken through the prophets. We believe in one holy catholic and apostolic Church. We acknowledge one baptism for the forgiveness of sins. We look for the resurrection of the dead, and the life of the world to come. Amen.**

We have not loved you with our whole heart; we have not loved our neighbours as ourselves. We are truly sorry and we humbly repent. For the sake of your Son Jesus Christ, have mercy on us and forgive us, that we may delight in your will, and walk in your ways, to the glory of your name. Amen.

Officiant: Almighty God have mercy upon you, pardon and deliver you from all your sins, confirm and strengthen you in all goodness, and keep you in eternal life; through Jesus Christ our Lord. **Amen.**

Officiant: The peace of the Lord be always with you.

All: And also with you.

Whether the future be dark or bright, the road be smooth or rough, whether our cares are light or heavy, our song be strong or weak, keep our hearts warm and our hands open, our lives ever embracing and ever embraced by your love. Amen.
