Leader: This Christmas, as we remember the birth of Jesus in a stable, we are reminded that hope comes in unexpected ways and in unfamiliar places. Trusting that God brings hope out of darkness, let us pray, saying: Let there be light!

We pray for places in our world that have been affected by earthquakes, flooding, and other disasters, and for all impacted by the Covid-19 pandemic; for people who wait anxiously for word of family members, for those who have lost loved ones, homes, and livelihoods, for those who live in grief and shock, for health care workers and first responders We remember all on our Christmas Memorial list and other departed loved ones. We pray for refugees of war and natural disaster, and for asylum seekers. For all homeless people wherever they are in the world (pause). Wherever the world is in darkness, Lord: **Let there be light!**

On the night of His Nativity, as we remember that Jesus came to seek and save the lost and to bring healing to a broken

world, we pray for the sick, the lonely, and the needy, especially those on our hearts tonight. (pause). Wherever the world is in darkness, Lord **Let there be light!**

This Christmas, as we remember those who went to the stable, we are reminded that we too are on a faith journey. We pray that we may come to know you and to love you more as we serve others. Wherever the world is in darkness, Lord. **Let there be light!**
