**MORE JESUS**

## DIGGING DEEPER

READ through Ephesians 3:14-21

What is God able to do according to this passage?

What do you think is behind mention of family in verse 15? (Hint - look through chapter 2 & the start of chapter three to get earlier in the chapter)

Why do you think Paul assumes the Ephesians have been *rooted and established in love* (v17)?

Throughout this passage the pronoun *You* is written in plural form. Do you think this passage applies to an individual, a church community, or both? Why?

Note the number of times the passage uses the word *power*. Where does the passage say this power comes from? Why do we need it so much?

## TAKING IT HOME

1. What does *more of Him, less of me* look like in my life right now?
2. What can I do this week to focus on the love of Christ in a deeper way?
3. How have I/ am I seeing this prayer answered in my own life/ in my church?
4. Who is someone I can pray this prayer for this coming week? Follow Paul's example and tell them what you're praying for them!
