The Diocese has suspended all in-person Services. *The number of active cases in the Diocese, including our area of Calgary, is decreasing, but still higher than when Services were suspended (in our part of the city, there were 549 active cases on Nov. 13; on Jan. 28, there were 675). The Diocesan COVID-19 Task Force is scheduled to give everyone an update soon.*

All Mothers and Children Count COVID-19 has had disastrous effects on maternal health care, already in dire straits, in many developing countries. An article in the medical journal, The Lancet, predicts a rising number of maternal deaths in 2021 due directly or indirectly to COVID, with a worst-case number of 113,400 globally. This only emphasizes the need for PWRDF's Maternal, Newborn, and Child Health Programme, and the clinics and outreach initiatives that it supports.
