Dear friends in Christ,

We begin this holy season by remembering our need for
repentance, and for the mercy and forgiveness

prayer, fasting, and almsgiving,
and by reading and meditating on the word of God.

and minds to worship god, our creator,
let us confess our sins.

**Most merciful God,
we confess that we have sinned against you in thought, word, and deed,
by what we have done
and by what we have left undone.
We have not loved you with our whole heart;
we have not loved our neighbours as ourselves.
We are truly sorry and we humbly repent.**

**For the sake of your Son Jesus Christ,
have mercy on us and forgive us,
that we may delight in your will,
and walk in your ways,
to the glory of your name. Amen.**

grant to your faithful people pardon and peace, that we may be cleansed
from all our sins and serve you with a quiet mind;
through Jesus Christ our Lord,
who is alive and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and for
ever. **Amen.**
