### **History/Origin of Mothering Sunday**

The first three Sundays in Lent are rather intense and heavily baptismal, focusing on striving manfully against the world, the flesh and the devil. Mothering Sunday brings relief through its focus on Jerusalem, the Church, the mother of the faithful. Accordingly, the rich biblical theme of motherhood naturally impacted a society where children often left home at a young age, and domestic servants, and apprenticed children were given leave by their employers to visit their “Mother Church,” the parish of their baptism, or the Cathedral of their hometown. On such visits, children naturally brought gifts, flowers, and special cakes for their mothers. The visits became a time for family reunions, and over a period of time the annual return to “Mother Church” came to include all mothers and was called “Mothering Sunday.”

Mothering Sunday was also known as Refreshment Sunday because the fasting rules for Lent were relaxed on that day. 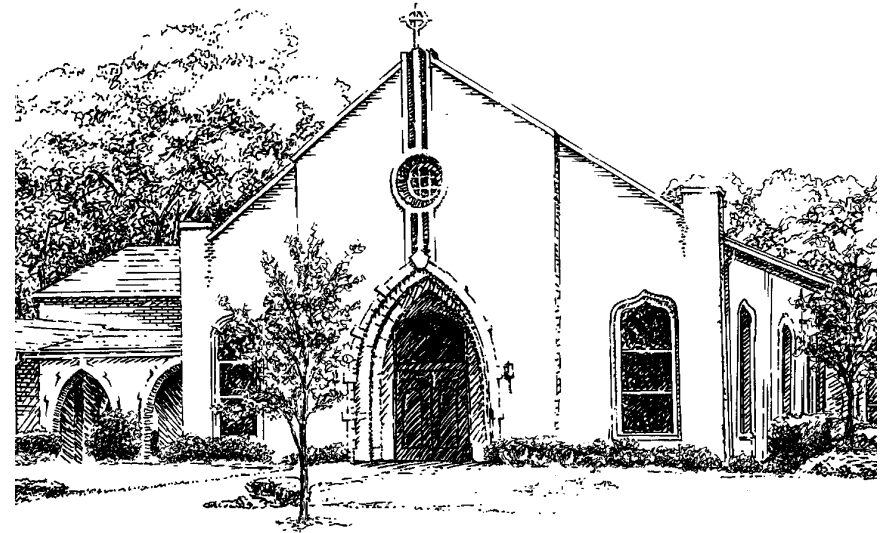
