Celebrant Creator, you made our world --- beautiful and good.
 You made us to live in right relationship with you and all creation.
 You sent Jesus to live among us and show us what you are like.

We give all thanks and praise to you, our true and loving God.
You laid the foundations of the earth and enclosed the seas.
You brought forth all creatures and gave breath to humankind.
Wondrous are you, Holy One.
All you create is a sign of hope for our journey.

And so, we join with the heavenly beings
and all of creation as we sing:

we present these gifts to you.

Send your Holy Spirit upon us and upon these gifts.
Sustain us by your grace and make us a people
of hope, justice and love.

Draw us together in Christ,
and, in the fullness of time,
gather us with all your people i
nto the joy of your eternal home.

Through Christ and with Christ and in Christ,
by the inspiration of your Holy
Spirit, we worship you our God and Creator
and we give you our unending praise. **Amen.**
