

#### Committee news

At our parish day of reflection and planning we set some goals and a variety of committees have started work on those goals.

The Christian Education group met this week with deputy warden Bill Ritchie. We looked at CE for all age groups in the parish. We were particularly attracted to a multigenerational program called Messy Church. We think we would like to try it out as soon as COVID ends.

We also discussed the possibility of a labyrinth on the church grounds and a few people will be exploring the feasibility and costs.

Jane Jennings is our librarian and her desire for some clear guidelines led to the development of a draft policy which the CE committee reviewed. It will be presented to the next Parish Council meeting for their consideration.

We also discussed construction of a small outdoor library shelf we could stock with books that are duplicates, and some Bibles, for people to take away.

# **Other Important Announcements**

#### Our Outreach Goes On

Please remember that we are engaged in ongoing outreach. The ministries we support are sometimes struggling because of reduced support.

The foodbank needs our support. Non-perishable foods, baby food and formula, diapers, sanitary products for women. Or money. You can give in kind through the church and your financial donations can go through the church or direct to the food bank. You will get a tax receipt in either case.

Grass Roots, Kind Hearts feeds people who are in need: a hot meal feels good in the cool weather. Diana Hicks works hard on this ministry, talk to her to offer help, give money to the church to buy food and other necessities.

Pray for those in need in our midst. They look just like us, and they might be us.

Our Bishop visited Parish Council.

On April 27 Bishop Anna and Brendan Neilson, who is the Diocesan Vision Animator, met with Council by Zoom.

After introductions she asked us where we thought we were in our parish life. She introduced a model of a parish life cycle. Most Council members felt that we were in a place of reflection and renewal.

We then reflected on another concept that asked us to consider the relationship between community needs, our own resources, and our sense of call. Council will be discussing this further.
